| 2. | $36.01$ <br> COMMENCEMENT | ${ }_{3}$ Opening Prayer <br> ${ }_{4}$ The Extra Ordinary Annual General Meeting commenced at 10:10 am with ${ }_{5}$ the opening prayer offered by Alhaji Abubakar Adamu, Council member ${ }_{\text {}}$ representing North West Zone. <br> ${ }_{7}$ Chairman's Opening Remarks <br> ${ }_{8}$ The Chairman of Council, Mr. Obaseki C. welcomed all members of Council, ${ }_{9}$ Management, and staff of the Institute and representatives of the ${ }_{10}$ Association of Science Laboratory Technologists of Nigeria (ASLTON) to the ${ }_{11}$ meeting. He thanked God for journey mercies and appreciated members ${ }_{12}$ for their passion and interest in ensuring the progress of the profession. He ${ }_{13}$ thanked them for their cooperation, steadfastness, and laudable ideas for ${ }_{14}$ moving the profession forward since their arrival at the Institute's ${ }_{15}$ Stakeholders' and Extra-Ordinary Annual General Meeting. He explained ${ }_{16}$ that the Extra Ordinary General meeting was meant to ensure that the ${ }_{17}$ Institute met its statutory responsibility of holding its Annual General ${ }_{18}$ Meeting for the year 2020 despite the restrictions and lock-down, as a ${ }_{19}$ result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the postponement of the Scientific ${ }_{20}$ National Conference for 2020 by ASLTON. He enjoined participants to make ${ }_{21}$ useful contributions to discussions and wished them successful ${ }_{22}$ deliberations. |  |

| 4. | 36.03 <br> MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES | ${ }_{29}$ MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES <br> i. ${ }_{30}$ Harassment of NISLT Members <br> ${ }_{31}$ The Chairman reported that the harassment of the Institute's members is ${ }_{32}$ still ongoing all over the country and a case of harassment of one of the ${ }_{33}$ Institute's members at Ikom in Cross-River State has been taken up by the |  |


|  |  | ${ }_{34}$ Institute in the court of law with legal representation by a Council member ${ }_{35}$ (Barrister Sunday Edet Etuk) and the Institute's Legal Officer. He added that ${ }_{36}$ there have been positive reports so far from the case. He also reported that ${ }_{37}$ a similar case in Delta State is being handled by the Institute's Legal Officer. <br> ii. ${ }_{38}$ NISLT Scientific National Conference <br> ${ }_{\text {39 The }}$ Chairman reported that the Scientific National Conference was ${ }_{40}$ postponed by ASLTON and said the information for the postponement was ${ }_{41}$ passed to the Institute and circulated to members of ASLTON nationwide. ${ }_{42} \mathrm{He}$ said that ASLTON should subsequently organize and hold the Scientific ${ }_{43}$ National Conference, while the Institute (NISLT) shall organize and hold the ${ }_{44}$ Annual General Meetings attached to ASLTON Scientific National ${ }_{45}$ Conferences. <br> iii. ${ }_{46}$ Modalities for the implementation of M\&E Task Team <br> ${ }_{47}$ The Chairman of Council informed all present that, the first phase of the ${ }_{48}$ implementation of the Monitoring and Evaluation (M\&E) Task Team Project ${ }_{49}$ has been completed by holding a training workshop for all state's ${ }_{50}$ Chairpersons of ASLTON and that the second phase will be handled by the ${ }_{51}$ Governing Council members in their respective zones. He said Council ${ }_{52}$ members shall be empowered to conduct training at the axis of the zones ${ }_{53}$ they represent in Council and reported that the cost implication of the ${ }_{54}$ logistics, accommodation, and transportation shall be provided by the ${ }_{55}$ Institute. The fund for the M\&E Task Team is already in the custody of the ${ }_{56}$ Institute and the funds shall be released as soon as approval is received ${ }_{57}$ from the Federal Ministry of Finance. <br> iv. ${ }_{58}$ Use of NISLT Logo <br> ${ }_{59}$ The Chairman said that the use of the Institute's (NISLT) logo without ${ }_{\text {so }}$ obtaining appropriate approval from the Governing Council and ${ }_{61}$ Management of the Institute is an Offence. He added that only ASLTON has ${ }_{62}$ the express approval to use the Institute's Logo and observed the illegal ${ }_{63}$ use of the logo by other associations, groups of persons, or individuals ${ }_{64}$ without obtaining the required permission from the institute's authorities ${ }_{65}$ which he said should be stopped. |  |
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|  |  | x. ${ }_{131}$ Quality of the Certificates of Attendance issued to Members for ${ }_{132}$ the Conference <br> ${ }_{133}$ The Chairman reported that the issue of the quality of Certificates of ${ }_{134}$ Attendance issued to participating members during the conference has ${ }_{135}$ been observed due to the low quality of the Certificates of Attendance ${ }^{136}$ presented to members at the $35^{\text {th }}$ Scientific Annual National Conference ${ }_{137}$ held at Ozoro, Delta State in 2019. He called on the ASLTON executives ${ }^{138}$ present, to take note of the complaint and take the necessary steps to ${ }_{139} \mathrm{ensure}$ an improvement in that regard. <br> xi. ${ }_{100}$ Curriculum Development for NUC and Polytechnic <br> ${ }_{141}$ The Chairman reported that he led a team to make a physical ${ }_{142}$ presentation of the SLT Degree Programme for Universities to the National ${ }_{143}$ Universities Commission at Abuja. He said that the Governing Council is ${ }_{144}$ going to look critically at the pros and cons of continuing with the SLT ${ }_{145}$ Programme at the Polytechnic, Colleges of Technology to decide on ${ }_{146}$ Whether to continue or stop the programme at those levels. <br> xii. ${ }_{14}$ Post-Graduate Degree Programme <br> ${ }_{148}$ The Chairman informed all present that, there is serious work in progress ${ }_{199}$ by the Governing Council and Management of the Institute towards ${ }_{150}$ ensuring that some selected universities commence the Post-Graduate ${ }_{151}$ Degree and Top-up Programmes in SLT for interested members of the ${ }_{152}$ profession. <br> xiii. $\quad{ }_{153}$ Headship of the Zonal Offices <br> ${ }_{154}$ The Chairman recalled the contentious issue of the headship of the ${ }_{155}$ Institute's Zonal Offices, he had highlighted it to be discussed at the end of ${ }_{156}$ the presentation of the Matters Arising from the Minutes of the $35^{\text {th }}$ AGM ${ }_{157}$ and explained further that some Administrative staff members of the ${ }_{158}$ Institute argued that Administrative Officers should also be entitled to be ${ }_{159}$ Head(s) of the Zonal Offices based on the levels of the categories of staff ${ }_{160}$ posted to operate the Offices. He requested for comments on the issue ${ }_{161}$ from the participants of the meeting. |
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${ }_{229}$ Would represent the stand of the Management on the matter. ${ }_{230}$ The Registrar also reported that, despite the paucity of funds, the ${ }_{231}$ Institute has commenced the payment of imprest to the zonal ${ }_{232}$ Offices. Though the imprest is not yet regular, the zonal offices are ${ }_{233}$ expected to undertake minor repair and maintenance from the ${ }_{234}$ monies forwarded for the running of the zonal offices. He also ${ }_{235}$ said the Head of the North-East Zonal Office ought to have ${ }_{236}$ notified the Institute's Management formally and request for ${ }_{237}$ funds to fix the observed problems or fix it and forward a request ${ }_{238}$ for the reimbursement of the funds spent in that regard.

- ${ }_{239}$ Mr. Ebaddan C. Williams (Council Member, representing South${ }_{240}$ West) Commented that it is important to find out how the Zonal ${ }_{241}$ Offices spend the imprest they receive from the Institute because ${ }_{242}$ they have many states to cover in their respective zones. He ${ }_{243}$ posited that the imprest is not likely to be sufficient for all the ${ }_{244}$ activities the zonal offices are expected to undertake.
- ${ }_{245}$ Mr. Oguntunde Abayomi (Council Member representing FMST) ${ }_{246}$ advised that the Zonal Offices should build good working ${ }_{247}$ relationships and show its relevance to the State Governments ${ }_{248}$ and other relevant major organizations in their respective zones. ${ }_{299} \mathrm{He}$ said this would likely provide an avenue for them to attract ${ }_{250}$ various types of assistance that could augment the allocations ${ }_{251}$ from the Institute.
${ }_{252}$ The Chairman appreciated the contribution of the Director, STP ${ }_{253}$ FMST and stated further that the South-South Zonal Office in ${ }_{254}$ Benin-City, Edo State, is located on the same floor as the State ${ }_{255}$ Ministry of Science and Technology, which houses the offices of ${ }_{256}$ the Honorable Commissioner of Science and Technology and the ${ }_{257}$ permanent Secretary of the Ministry. He added that the Ministry ${ }_{258}$ was established in 2018 and they have requested for the Institute ${ }_{259}$ through its zonal coordinator to assist in the provision of the ${ }_{260}$ much needed technical support in making the Ministry effective ${ }_{261}$ and efficient in moving Science and Technology forward at all

${ }_{293}$ said all existing documents that could assist in the course of ${ }_{294}$ checking the harassment of members, should be examined and ${ }_{295}$ implemented as soon as possible. He reported that the case of ${ }_{296}$ Harassment he is handling on behalf of the Institute at Ikom, ${ }_{29}$ Cross-River State is going on well with a positive outcome and that ${ }_{298}$ the case has been adjourned to $20^{\text {th }}$ January 2021.
- ${ }^{299}$ Mr. Adeyemi O.J (National Sec. Gen., ALSTON) highlighted the ${ }_{300}$ importance of identifying the specific areas of conflict between ${ }_{301}$ the Science Laboratory Technologists and the Medical Laboratory ${ }_{302}$ Scientist and that whether members facing harassment from the ${ }_{303} \mathrm{MLSCN}$ on the operation of private laboratories are qualified to do ${ }_{304} 50$ and have obtained the necessary approval to operate such ${ }_{305}$ laboratories.
${ }_{306}$ The Chairman in his response said that the procedure for the ${ }_{30}$ establishment of private laboratories by interested members of ${ }_{308}$ NISLT is clearly spelt out by the Institute's Rules and Regulations. ${ }_{309}$ The Institute provides the guidelines for the establishment of all ${ }_{310}$ types of laboratories in the area of SLT and ensures that it ${ }_{311}$ conforms to minimum standards before giving the necessary ${ }_{312}$ approval. In other words, he said all SLT private laboratories must ${ }_{313}$ be registered with the Institute to legitimize their operations and ${ }_{314}$ that when the necessary approval to undertake specific laboratory ${ }_{315}$ procedures is obtained from NISLT. Then, the Institute can ${ }_{316}$ Confidently rise to defend and protect such laboratories when ${ }_{31}$ they are harassed by the MLSCN. He said that NISLT cannot ${ }_{318}$ defend a laboratory that is not registered with it.
- ${ }_{319}$ Mr. Ebaddan C. Williams (Council Member, representing South${ }_{320}$ West) asked if the private laboratory of the member whose case ${ }_{321}$ of harassment is being handled in the court-of-law by the Institute ${ }_{322}$ in Cross -River State has been inspected.
${ }_{323}$ The Registrar informed him that the laboratory of the member ${ }_{324}$ Was visited for assessment and the report of the assessment




|  |  | ${ }_{425}$ Mr. Ebaddan C. Williams (Council Member, representing South${ }_{426}$ West) also appealed for the establishment of a separate South${ }_{427}$ West Zonal Office for the Institute and a liaison office in Lagos ${ }_{428}$ State. <br> ${ }_{429}$ The Chairman in his responses apologized for the omission of Mr. ${ }_{430}$ Gberindyer's name in the Minutes of the last AGM while ${ }_{431}$ informing him that six (6) zonal offices were requested for by the ${ }_{432}$ Institute and Government approved only four (4) out of which ${ }_{43}$ three (3) have been activated with the North-West zone to be ${ }_{434}$ located in Kano State which is still awaiting activation due to office ${ }_{435}$ accommodation challenges. He added that the Government has ${ }_{436}$ assumed that the Institute's Secretariat at Samonda, Ibadan, Oyo ${ }_{43}$ State, is regarded as a south-west zonal office and the Abuja, ${ }_{438}$ Office located at Jabi, Airport Road is regarded as the North${ }_{439}$ Central zonal office of the Institute. However, the Chairman said a ${ }_{400}$ ot of personal efforts are being put in place to get the present ${ }_{441}$ Zonal offices functioning and appealed to the Registrar to do all in ${ }_{492}$ his power to ensure other offices are established in the North${ }_{443}$ Central and South-West of the country. <br> - ${ }_{444}$ Mr. Damos S.N. (National President, ASLTON) on the non${ }_{445}$ payment of annual dues by members, called on Council Zonal ${ }_{46}$ Representatives in each zone to be more effective on the ${ }_{477}$ Sensitization of members on the need to pay their annual dues. He ${ }_{448}$ added that members are usually discouraged from paying their ${ }_{499}$ annual dues consistently as a result of the perceived low benefits ${ }_{450}$ accruing from the Institute to its members. <br> - ${ }_{451}$ Mr. Gberindyer James (Council member, North- Central) pointed ${ }_{452}$ Out that the Institute's Governing Council, Management and ${ }_{453}$ ASLTON have roles to play in encouraging professional members ${ }_{454}$ to pay their annual dues and that the Council cannot do it alone. ${ }_{455} \mathrm{He}$ tasked the ASLTON leadership at all levels to up-scale their ${ }_{45}$ sensitization activities towards ensuring their members pay ${ }_{457}$ annual dues as when appropriate and engage the Institute's ${ }_{458}$ Management in formulating ways to improve the payment of dues |  |
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|  |  | 459by members. <br> ${ }_{460}$ Mr. James Waba (Council member, North-East) suggested that the ${ }_{461}$ presentation of the2019 Annual Management Report and Accounts should ${ }_{462}$ be moved to the last item on the meeting's agenda. This was generally ${ }_{463}$ accepted by all in the meeting. |  |
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| 5. | 36.05 <br> AMMENDEMENT OF NISLT ACT | ${ }_{464}$ The Chairman reported that the Amendment of the NISLT Act by the ${ }_{465}$ National Assembly was an uphill task but the Council shall continue to ${ }_{466}$ make all efforts in exploiting all that is required to ensure the amendment ${ }_{467}$ Of the Act. He informed the meeting that fund will be needed and a Three${ }_{468}$ man Committee shall be constituted (amongst which will be Barrister ${ }_{469}$ Sunday Edet Etuk) to look critically at the subject. |  |
| 6. | 36.06 <br> SLT PROGRAMME <br> IN THE POLYTECHNIC | ${ }_{470}$ The Chairman reported that, rather than the complete scrapping of the SLT ${ }_{471}$ programme in the Polytechnics, the Governing Council Committee on ${ }_{472}$ Education will modify the SLT programmes in collaboration with National ${ }_{473}$ Board For Technical Education (NBTE) to ensure that the Institute's ${ }_{474}$ professional members are thrown out out of employment. |  |
| 7. | 36.07 <br> ACCREDITATION OF SLT COURSES <br> IN THE UNIVERSITY \& POLYTECHNIC LEVELS | 475The Chairman reported that the curriculum and accreditation requirements ${ }_{476}$ for universities and polytechnics have been presented to the National ${ }_{477}$ University Commission (NUC) and that of NBTE undergoing review. He ${ }_{478}$ reported further that the Institute's team (the Chairman, Vice-Chairman of ${ }_{479}$ Council, The Director-General/Registrar and representatives of the Federal ${ }_{480}$ Ministry of Science and Technology and Federal Ministry of Education) ${ }_{481}$ presented the curriculum to NUC. The Registrar promised to continue ${ }_{482}$ Working on the implementation of the curriculum by NUC |  |
| 8. | 36.08 <br> HEADSHIP OF SLT PROGRAMME | ${ }_{483}$ The Chairman said the Headship of the SLT Programme by professional ${ }_{484}$ members will be a gradual process due to the non-availability of ${ }_{485}$ adequately qualified and experienced manpower to head the faculties and ${ }_{486}$ departments in the Institutions where they exist. He mentioned that the ${ }_{487}$ University of Port-Harcourt in Rivers State has created SLT Faculty and has ${ }_{488}$ commenced a Master's Degree Programme in SLT and they are also ${ }_{489}$ Working on starting a P.hD. Programme in SLT with due consultation by the ${ }_{490}$ Institute. He said presently, the faculty is headed by a Medical Laboratory ${ }_{491}$ Science Technologist due to the dearth of sufficiently qualified SLT ${ }_{492}$ personnel to head the faculty. He reported that the university authority |  |


|  |  | ${ }^{493}$ Was working gradually to ensure its SLT programme graduates are engaged ${ }_{494}$ in relevant programmes to equip them to take over the headship of the SLT ${ }_{495}$ faculty. <br> - ${ }_{447}$ Mr. S.O Emmanuel (NISLT, Ibadan) brought to the attention of the ${ }_{448}$ meeting, his inability to get admitted for an academic Master's ${ }_{499}$ Degree programme at Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago-Iwoye, ${ }_{450}$ Ogun State despite the possession of an HND and PGD ${ }_{451}$ certificates. He expressed worry that, this development could ${ }_{452}$ hinder his aspirations to undertake a P.HD. programme in the ${ }_{453}$ future. Because of his experience he suggested that the SLT ${ }_{454}$ programme should be discontinued at the polytechnic level. <br> ${ }_{456}$ The Chairman responded by acknowledging that the issue of the ${ }_{457}$ challenges faced by the HND holders is a general and national ${ }_{458}$ issue not peculiar to SLT alone and that the dichotomy between ${ }_{459}$ the B.Sc. and HND certificates has not been solved. He concluded a60 by saying that the institute can only make suggestions to ${ }_{461}$ Government on the issue. |  |
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| 9. | 36.04 <br> PRESENTATION OF 2019 ANNUAL <br> MANAGEMENT <br>  <br> ACCOUNTS | 462The Registrar/CEO reported that the unusual circumstances caused by the ${ }_{463}$ Covid-19 pandemic and the ENDSARS protest/riots which both affected ${ }_{464}$ routine office and business activities all over the country caused ${ }_{465}$ unavoidable delays in obtaining the necessary inputs from the Office of the ${ }_{466}$ Honourable Minister of Science \& Technology and the necessary vetting ${ }_{467}$ and approval by the Governing Council Committee on Finance before going ${ }_{468}$ to press for the printing and presentation at the Extra-Ordinary Annual ${ }_{469}$ General Meeting. He said based on the provision of the Act of the Institute, 470he was ready to present the Management Report and the nstitute's ${ }_{471}$ external Auditor was on standby to virtually present the 2019 Annual ${ }_{472}$ Audit Report. <br> - ${ }_{473}$ Mr. Ebaddan C. Williams (Council Member, representing South${ }_{474}$ West) expressed his disappointment on the quality of print of the ${ }_{475}$ Management's Report. He compared it with those of the three ${ }_{476}$ previous years. He said the document should have been in ${ }_{47}$ Standard print for presentation at the EOAGM. |  |

- ${ }_{478}$ Mr. Onyebuchi Urgoji (Council member representing Public ${ }_{479}$ interest) in comment, said since the same Management of the ${ }_{480}$ Institute, ensured a successful standardized printing of the Annual ${ }_{481}$ Management and Audit Reports for the past three years as ${ }_{482}$ referred to by Mr. Ebaddan, according to him the situation leading ${ }_{483}$ to the inability to present the reports as done in previous years is ${ }_{484}$ understandable, especially with the challenges posed by the ${ }_{485}$ Covid-19 pandemic and ENDSARS protests/riots. He said that ${ }_{486}$ the Registrar's explanations were acceptable.
${ }_{487}$ The registrar explained that, going ahead to the press to print final ${ }_{488}$ copies of the reports without going through the necessary due ${ }_{489}$ process of vetting for errors would have resulted in wastage of ${ }_{490}$ funds. However, he said if the Chairman Council Committee on ${ }_{491}$ Finance gives his express approval, he will go-ahead to present ${ }_{492}$ the reports.
${ }_{493}$ The chairman further explained the various challenges as reported ${ }_{494}$ by the Registrar for the inability to produce a final copy of the ${ }_{495}$ reports.
- ${ }_{496}$ Chairman Council Committee on Finance (Elder. Olu Ajayi ${ }_{497}$ Michael) gave verbal approval on behalf of the Committee for the ${ }_{498}$ presentation of the 2019 Managements Annual Reports at the ${ }_{499} E O A G M$,
- ${ }_{500}$ The Chairman, Governing Council directed the Registrar to ensure ${ }_{501}$ the necessary corrections are done and approvals are obtained ${ }_{502}$ from the Council's Finance Committee before going to press and ${ }_{503}$ then forward the final printed copy to all Stakeholders in the 504 meeting.
- ${ }_{\text {505 }}$ Mr. Oguntunde Abayomi (Council member representing FMST) in ${ }_{506} \mathrm{his}$ comment, called on all stakeholders at the meeting to ${ }_{50}$ understand the challenges that militated against the successful ${ }_{508}$ presentation of the reports as done in the past years.

|  |  | - ${ }_{509}$ Mr. Damos S.N. (National President, ASLTON) asked whether the ${ }_{510}$ stakeholders shall reconvene for the presentation of the Reports. <br> ${ }_{511}$ The Chairman in his response said that all stakeholders shall be ${ }_{512}$ informed in due course, when the report shall be represented or ${ }_{513}$ Orwarded to them. |  |
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| 10. | ANY OTHER BUSSINESS | - ${ }_{514} \mathrm{Mr}$. Oluwafisoye Peter (Director, Education, Training \& ${ }_{515}$ Inspection. NISLT) announced that the schedule for the Institute's 5162021 Training Programme was ready and shall be published on the ${ }_{517}$ Institute's website and hard copies would be forwarded to all ${ }_{518}$ ASLTON state branches. He advised all members to avail ${ }_{59}$ themselves of the opportunity to attend the training. He said that ${ }_{520}$ there are innovations and training aimed at addressing ${ }_{521} \mathrm{entrepreneurship} \mathrm{for} \mathrm{members} \mathrm{of} \mathrm{the} \mathrm{profession}$. ${ }_{522}$ expressed hope that the proposed Scheme of Service for ${ }_{523}$ Laboratory Technologists/ Scientists shall come to fruition in the ${ }_{524}$ nearest future. <br> - ${ }_{525}$ Elder Olu Ajayi Micheal (Council member representing South${ }_{526}$ West), as the Chairman of the Governing Council Committee on ${ }_{527}$ Finance and General Purpose, he reported that the Committee ${ }_{528}$ has gone through the reports and is giving the Registrar the ${ }_{529}$ necessary approval to proceed with the printing of the final copy ${ }_{530}$ of the 2019 Annual Management and Audit Reports for ${ }_{531}$ presentation to the stakeholders. <br> - ${ }_{532}$ Mr. Damos S.N. (National President, ASLTON) said the Governing ${ }_{533}$ Council should work to ensure that SLT programmes at the ${ }_{534}$ Universities are converted to Faculties of SLT or School of SLT due ${ }_{535}$ to the wide options in the SLT professional programme. He also ${ }_{536}$ highlighted the need for the nstitute to connect with Unity and ${ }_{53}$ Secondary Schools in view of creating employment opportunities ${ }_{538}$ for graduates of SLT. He also expressed the appreciation of the ${ }_{539}$ ASLTON for being invited to the EOAGM and apologized for the ${ }_{540}$ inability of the Association to hold the 2020 Annual Scientific |  |
